- Use simple WYSIWYG tools to create a web site

Course Notes (Policies & Procedures)

Projects: The bulk of the course (60%) is designed to give students hands-on experience working with actual web sites. Students will choose a combination of web sites to work on from simple updating chores to complete design and develop. Working on your own, or in groups of no more than 3, students will choose from one of three project tracks. This decision should be based on past experience with web development, your expectations for developing your web skills in the classroom, and your ability to self direct your learning outside of the classroom.

The following is a list of web sites that need help. Each web site is unique and either in current use or is to be published within the next few months. All projects will be evaluated by the both the instructor and the client. Any project adopted by the client and posted to the internet will receive a mark of 100%. All other projects will be marked on the following criteria: effectiveness, affectiveness, and navigational efficiency.

- o www.vho.ca The web site of an independent consultant. The site was created approximately 4 years ago and looks out of date. The content is complete but the design needs minor updating.
- o www.bcitfsa.ca The BCIT Faculty and Staff Association web site. This site was overhauled last year to its present state. Some minor updating and maintenance (publishing a newsletter) is needed.
- o www.business.bcit.ca/davidm your instructor's web site. This is a skeletal site requiring further development.
- o www.gkn.ca Grant Kovacs Norell web site. This is a web site for a downtown Vancouver law firm. A flash page has already been created as a starting point. The rest of the site needs to be developed.
- o **www.gerardhivon.com** The future web site for a design consultant to be published within the next few months. Some content has been prepared along with some design suggestions and images.
- o **your own web site** create your own web site. You should have a minimum of 3 pages. You are free to use an old one, but you should update the information. This will be published to the instructor's web site.
