  - e. entering the operating room
  - f. administering a cleansing enema
2. Use surgical asepsis when performing the following procedures:
  - a. applying a sterile dressing
  - b. inserting a urethral catheter
  - c. carrying out a surgical scrub
  - d. donning a sterile gown and gloves
3. Explain the required interventions when working with patients who are:
  - a. violent or who have the potential to be violent
  - b. scheduled for a procedure for which an anesthetic agent is required
  - c. recovering from a spinal injury
4. Use isolation protocols appropriately.
5. Communicate significant data to other health care personnel.
