- 3. Explain the required interventions when working with patients who are:
  - a. violent or who have the potential to be violent
  - b. scheduled for a procedure for which an anesthetic agent is required
  - c. recovering from a spinal injury
- 4. Use isolation protocols appropriately.
- 5. Communicate significant data to other health care personnel.
