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LEARNING EXPERIENCES

The first week of the term is spent in the classroom focusing on the integration of all components of the curriculum. An orientation to the preceptorship is included.

During the next 16 weeks, the student is assigned to a preceptor in a hospital and works the same hours as the preceptor. The student gains an understanding of the requirements of practice in a work setting. As the student's nursing skills and self-confidence develop, s/he assumes an increasingly complex patient assignment. Throughout the preceptorship, the preceptor supervises the student directly. The instructor is available for consultation, assistance, advice and support.
